PALM CITY — Since the beginning of March, hundreds of volunteers have come out to participate in the Great American Cleanup (GAC) Extreme Martin Makeover, coordinated locally by Keep Martin Beautiful (KMB).

The Extreme Martin Makeover is a series of revitalization and beautification projects, as well as community improvement events that began March 1 and will continue until May 31 as part of the Great American Cleanup.

It's not too late to volunteer, as there are still opportunities to be a part of the Great American Cleanup. Upcoming cleanups include a neighborhood cleanup in Port Salerno on May 15 and a cleanup of Booker Park and Westbrook in Indiantown on May 22. Both of these events will begin at 8 a.m. and volunteers are encouraged to come out to either site to help in cleanup efforts.

Neighborhood groups, civic clubs, schools, scouts, businesses and individuals can all be part of the GAC. Volunteers can organize their own clean up activity or sign up for a site already

identified by KMB. All cleanup projects that take place between March and May will count as part of the GAC, and volunteer groups will be provided with supplies including trash bags, water and T-shirts (while supplies last).
